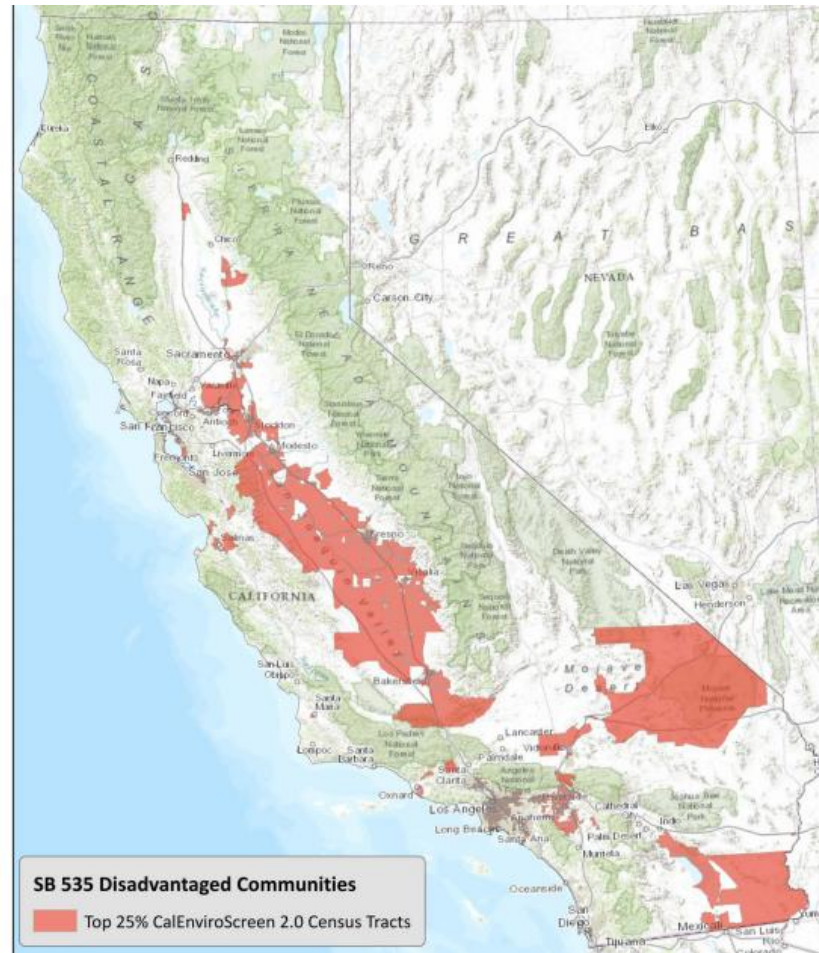
I. SUMMARY

- Dedicates \$1 billion in funding over 10 years -- \$100 million annually

Governor Brown Signs AB 802

- Whole-building data available to owners upon request, pathway for more efficient access to tenant data (with consent).
- Statewide benchmarking for multifamily residential and commercial buildings
