Include any displacement that occurred or is likely, stress or anxiety and any manifestations thereof (illness, etc.), any additional costs that tenants will have or now pay that didn=t have to pay before and how that affects their lives (how the additional costs have resulted in the inability to pay for other essentials, etc.).
- 6. Describe any effects on other vulnerable tenants and how you know about those.
- 7. Describe any difficulties in finding comparable alternative housing because of the current market including vacancy rates, etc. Describe how the loss of these units has affected the community and low income/vulnerable tenants in need of affordable housing.
