
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


Background–Twin Cities Region

In **2000**, 53 census tracts were considered RCAPs. 6% of the region's residents lived in an RCAP.

In **2007-2011**, 80 census tracts were considered RCAPs. 9% of the region's residents lived in an RCAP.



Regional Analysis of Impediments (RAI)

Conducted by Fair Housing Implementation Council (FHIC). Low level representation of Entitlement Jurisdictions.

RAIs in 2009 and 2014:

- Vague on larger issues of racial and economic segregation
- No actions identified to address larger issues
- 2014 RAI leaves out any discussion of relative affordable housing efforts within the region

Capitalizing on HUD's new AFH Rule

No AFHs due in region until after 2020

Minneapolis and St. Paul want a do-over on RAI— more like AFH?

Pending Regional Fair Housing Complaints at HUD

Pending Regional Fair Housing Complaints

Gist of complaints: funders assign too many resources to central cities, Met Council allocates affordable housing need so as to reinforce racial segregation, RAI inadequate.
