What are the big content updates in the Green Book 6th edition?

The new 6th edition content includes:

- a new section on tenants' post-pandemic rights pursuant to The Coronavirus Aid,
 Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act;
- updates to the federal housing programs pursuant to the Housing Opportunity
 Through Modernization Act (HOTMA) of 2016;
- HUD's updated inspection standards according to the 2023 National Standards for the Physical Inspection of Real Estate (NSPIRE) final rule;
- affordable housing preservation with an updated section on the Rental Assistance Demonstration (RAD) program;
- Additional key updates include the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) 2022
 Reauthorization, challenges to crime-free programs and nuisance property
 ordinances, advocate opportunities to influence the Affirmatively Furthering Fair
 Housing process, Section 504, Title VI and more!
